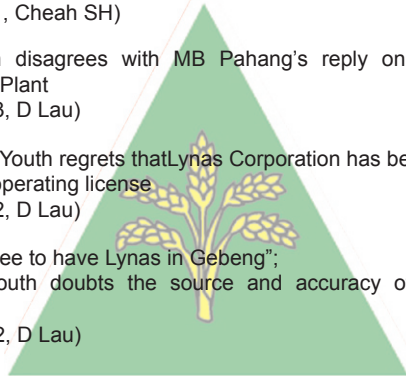




Environment

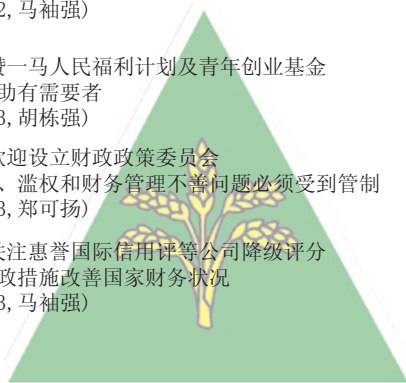

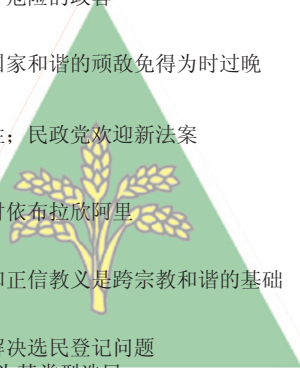
